SUPERVISION AGREEMENT

In accordance with the authority of the laws of the State of Kansas, through Juvenile Justice Code 38-1673 and amendments thereto, with execution of these orders and their enforcement through local rules, you are notified that you are in the custody of the Kansas Department of Corrections – Juvenile Services and shall remain so until you successfully complete the terms of your supervision.

At the time of this disposition the Reno County - Division IV Court ordered your participation and successful completion of this Supervision program. To successfully complete the program, you will be required to comply with all orders of your Case Manager/Intensive Supervision Officer (ISO) and the Court as set forth below:

- 1. Obey all laws of the United States, and the State of Kansas and any other jurisdiction to which you may be subject, reporting any contact with any law enforcement agency to your Case Manager/ISO within 48 hours.
- 2. Report to the Case Manager/ISO as directed. You must keep your Case Manager/ISO advised of your residence and current phone number at all times. A written travel permit must be obtained to travel outside the county of your residence. Verbal permission may be obtained when accompanied by parent or guardian.
- 3. You will be required to make payments to the court as indicated below:

You will be required to supply any documentation (paystubs, grades, etc.) deemed necessary by your Case Manager/ISO to certify your compliance with this Agreement. Payment to Community Corrections shall be made payable in money order form with a minimum payment of \$20.00 due by the 10th of each month.

- 4. You shall not be involved in violence or threats of violence of any kind.
- 5. You will be required to maintain employment or be actively involved in a career training program.
- 6. You shall not change your place of residence, employment or training without the **specific prior approval** of your Case Manager/ISO. If you are dismissed/fired from your job, suspended (in or out of school suspension) or expelled from school, you must make immediate notification to your Case Manager/ISO.
- 7. You shall refrain from using alcohol and all illegal drugs. Also, you shall refrain from entering into any liquor store, tavern or bar.
- 8. You must permit the Case Manager/ISO to visit you and/or your parents or guardians in your home, place of employment or elsewhere.
- 9. You must obey the reasonable and lawful commands of your parents.
- 10. **Parents or Guardians:** Any and all firearms, ammunition or any other weapons as designated by the Case Manager/ISO that are located within the home of the juvenile offender must be registered with this office. Further, the firearms, ammunition or any other weapons designated by the Case Manager/ISO must be locked in a secure location and fashion away from the respondent.
- 11. You must obey all reasonable demands of your Case Manager/ISO or the Court.
- 12. If directed, reside in a residential facility, whether located within or outside of the community, for the purpose of participating in education, counseling, or other rehabilitative programs.
- 13. You may be placed in a detention facility at the discretion of your Case Manager/ISO when circumstances indicate

statutory criteria have been met (K.S.A. 38-1640, 38-1663[6]).

- 14. You shall observe a curfew of 6:00 p.m first 30 days. The times that you may be away from your place of residence is to be determined by your Case Manager/ISO. All other times, you must be at home, <u>unless accompanied by your parents</u> or guardians.
- 15. You shall agree to any alcohol or drug testing that may be required by your Case Manager/ISO. Contractual services provided by this agency, the Kansas Department of Corrections Juvenile Services, or community service providers may require reimbursement by you and/or your parents pursuant to K.S.A 38-1663 and amendments thereto.
- 16. You are assigned 20 hours of community service work as part of your supervision with the Juvenile Community Corrections program.
- 17. You will submit truthful and accurate reports to your ISP Officer/Case Manager and will not engage in disruptive, loud, obscene or abuse behavior while on Community Corrections property or towards Community Corrections Staff.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

SANCTIONS FOR VIOLATION OF THE SUPERVISION AGREEMENT

Sanctions are penalties that will be levied against you by either the Court or the Case Manager/ISO with the approval of the Director of Community Corrections. These sanctions may be applied to you from the moment you are assigned to the Kansas Department of Corrections -Juvenile Services with Community Corrections until you are officially terminated by the Court. Failure to comply with the conditions in this Agreement or by the Court may result in:

- 1. **Probation** the judge may place you back on probation with certain conditions.
- 2. Placed in the custody of someone other than your parents, such as an aunt, uncle or family friend.
- 3. **Placed** in a foster home, a group home, or a state juvenile correctional facility.
- 4. <u>**Directly**</u> commit you to a state juvenile correctional facility.
- 5. **Discharged** from the Court's jurisdiction.

The Case Manager/ISO may assign certain tasks or programs that would be in the offender's best interest. The responsibility to complete these tasks or programs are that of the parents and the juvenile offender.

<u>Electronic Monitoring.</u> The juvenile offender may be assigned to home detention for a specified period of time. The guardians or parents and the juvenile offender will be required to pay for this program. You must be approved for this program by the Director of Community Corrections.

<u>Community Service Hours.</u> You may be assigned community service hours at the discretion of the Case Manager/ISO. The number of hours assigned will depend upon the type and number of violations.

<u>Drug Treatment/Mental Health Counseling</u> either inpatient or outpatient. You may be required to participate in such programs and will be determined by your needs and ability to pay. You must successfully complete the program which will be determined by the counselor of the program and your Case Manager/ISO. Failure to successfully complete the program will result in bringing the case back before the judge.

<u>Placement</u> in a more restrictive phase of the program. You could be placed at the beginning of the phase and be expected to complete the program from that point on. The assignment of this alternative is at the discretion of the Case Manager/ISO.

<u>Curfew.</u> You may be restricted to your home up to 24 hours a day. The times and the assignment of this sanction are at the discretion of the Case Manager/ISO.

PARENTAL OR GUARDIAN RESPONSIBILITIES

Pursuant to Kansas Statutes Annotated 38-1663a subsection (b)(1) "the court may order the juvenile offender and the parents of the offender to attend counseling sessions as the court directs."

As a parent or guardian of the juvenile offender, you should understand that you are responsible for your child's behavior and actions. Your agreement to assist the Case Manager/ISO and Community Corrections in the supervision of the juvenile offender is vital to the success of the program. Failure of your part to report to the Case Manager/ISO any violations of the Supervision Agreement may result in a contempt of court charge!
