Note: This is NOT an appointment system. The Reno County Health Department will contact you for appointment scheduling or with other available vaccination options.

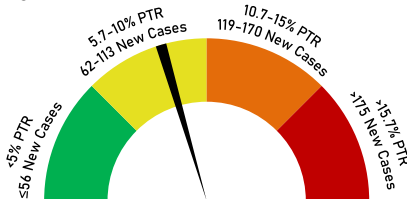

Health Order extends Amended Health Order 20-05 regarding

Gatherings of "10" people, the order will expire on 2/24/21. We need to continue to social distance, wear a mask, wash hands, get vaccinated when available and stay home if you are feeling ill.

New testing site please go online at www.gogettested.com. The site will allow those wanting to be tested to choose their testing site, time, and will take you through a short series of screening questions. You should be able to drive through be tested at your designated time and results will come back to you in approximately 48 hours via e-mail or text however you designate that you want to be contacted. Testing is a saliva test and you don't have to have an appointment to get tested, although it's not required.

Emergency Management Reminders:

- Reno County Commissioner declared a public health emergency on March 19, 2020 and extended this disaster declaration to March 31, 2021

- The state disaster declaration is extended until March 31, 2021

STATE OF KANSAS UPDATES

2/18/2021: As of February 17, 2021, the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) reported a total of 288,717 (+1,267) positive COVID-19 cases, across all Kansas counties, with 4,521 (+115) cases resulting in death. 104 counties, and all Kansas tribes, have a valid state of local disaster declaration. The Southwest Power Pool (SPP) as of 0930 am is no longer under an energy emergency alert. Due to high loads it will remain in a period of conservative operations until February 20, 2021 at 10 p.m. Load and generation fluctuation over the next 48 hours are anticipated. Many jurisdictions are reporting burst pipe
