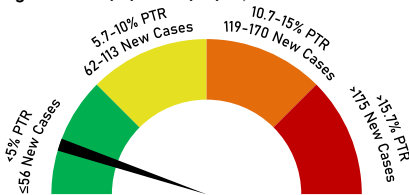

You should be able to drive through be tested at your designated time and results will come back to you in approximately 48 hours via e-mail or text however you designate that you want to be contacted. Testing is a saliva test and you don't have to have an appointment to get tested, although it's not required.

- The state disaster declaration is extended until May 28, 2021

STATE OF KANSAS UPDATES

3/31/2021: One-Hundred and four (104) counties, as well as all Native American tribes in Kansas, have a valid state of local disaster declarations on file. Wildland fire will be the story of the week, as conditions persist throughout the state into the weekend. Four National Guard Blackhawks were placed on standby today, along with T95 and a single engine tanker. The SEOC will continue to monitor fire weather for the rest of the week. Staff are working with a state agency for PPE distribution as well.
